increase in cost of the Depot carrying out the 'MOT' vehicle test. The frequency that each vehicle has to undergo a mid term test depends on the four months. age of the vehicle. At present, any vehicle aged over 4 years old has to have a test every six months; a vehicle over 7 years old has to have a test every \* The mid term vehicle test has been increased by £12.50, this reflects the increase in cost of the Depot carrying out the 'MOT' vehicle test. The proposed fees relating to the vehicles licences, combined drivers licence and operator's licence will need to be advertised. All fees and charges will come into effect as soon as possible after 1<sup>st</sup> April 2007."

At the meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2006, the Committee agreed to defer consideration of the fees pending further information.

In view of this request, Appendix 'A' sets out the expenditure associated with taxi licensing; Appendix 'B' sets out the estimated income based on the current taxi licence fees, together with projected income levels of 2.5% and 5%.

Based on these comparisons, and on the views expressed by those owners who have responded to the consultation, and that the cost of 2-mile journey in Bromsgrove is just over the national average, Members may wish to consider not increasing the table of fares for 2007/08.

There are no direct financial implications arising from this report
