What complaints does the Standards Committee deal with?

complaint to the Standards Committee it must be in writing. You should say who it is about and why you think they have not followed the Code of things that are not covered by the Members' Code of Conduct. of a Member of its council or authority. It will not deal with complaints about The Conduct. Standards Committee can only deal with complaints about the behaviour lf you make a

to it. complaint it will set up a meeting of no less than three members of the Committee to decide what should happen next. Once you have made a complaint you will be told in writing what will happen If the authority decides that the Standards Committee will deal with your

Standards Committee. This should happen within 20 days The meeting will be chaired by one of the independent people on the

- Investigate your complaint.
- Take some other action.
