




## Priority Ward 2009/10 YTD: Catshill

**Catshill Ward - 180** incidents reported in April-July 2009, a 76.5% increase compared to April-July 2008

**Marlbrook Ward – 62** incidents reported in April-July 2009, a 14.8% increase compared to April-July 2008

- The level of anti-social behaviour in Catshill and Marlbrook Wards combined increased again during July 2009, with 61 incidents recorded across the 2 wards.
- This overall increase was a combination of a decrease in reports in Catshill ward (4 fewer than June 09) and an increase in reports in Marlbrook ward (10 more than last month).

- Of the 22 reports in Marlbrook ward, only 8 were linked to youth disorder, mainly occurring on Spencer Walk, Milton Road and Barley Mow Lane. The other 14 incidents were linked to parking issues, nuisance neighbours and more domestic incidents.
- 20 of the 39 reports in Catshill ward were linked to youths. Incidents were well spread across the area with focus around the Dock.
- Bromsgrove CDRP are aware of this trend and the issue was raised at Tasking in July and August 2009.

**Other areas of increased incidents showing high % increases:**

**Hollywood and Majors Green** - 61 incidents reported in April-July 2009, a 79.4% increase compared to April-July 2008

- 12 out of 19 incidents in July were linked to or potentially linked to youths – this is unusually high for this ward, but can be expected due to the summer holidays.

**Stoke Prior** – 52 incidents reported in April-July 2009, a 73.3% increase compared to April-July 2008

- 6 of the 14 incidents in July related to issues caused by Travellers located in the Buntsford Park Industrial Estate area, or on Hanbury Road.
- 4 incidents related to motorbikes being ridden around the village of Stoke Prior, mainly by youths.

**Uffdown** – 61 incidents reported in April-July 2009, a 60.5% increase compared to April-July 2008

- No reports this month related to neighbour nuisance, however the total number of incidents has remained the same as last month.
- 7 of the 18 incidents related to motorbikes being ridden around fields on Newtown Lane (Romsley) or Gannow Green Lane.
- There were a further 2 reports of vehicles including a scooter being ridden/driven around Romsley.
