HEARING PROCEDURE

- 1. The Chairman will open the hearing and introduce members of the Sub-Committee and officers present.
- 2. The Chairman will ask all other people present to introduce themselves.
- 3. The Chairman will inform those present that the meeting is being recorded.
- 4. The Chairman will remind the Applicant and each party present that they can be represented by a legal representative at their own expense.
- 5. The Licensing Officer will present the report.
- 6. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the Licensing Officer.
- 7. The Chairman will invite the Applicant and/or his/her representative to present his/her case and call any witnesses. The Applicant will be allowed a maximum of 10 minutes to present the case.
- 8. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the Applicant.
- 9. The Chairman will invite the Responsible Authorities to present their representations. New representations must not be raised. The Responsible Authorities will be allowed a total of 10 minutes to present their case(s). If two or more Responsible Authorities wish to address the Sub-Committee the 10 minutes will be divided between them.
- 10. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the Responsible Authorities.
- 11. Interested Parties will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson (which may be a Councillor) to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised. A maximum of 10 minutes will be allowed for the Interested Parties to present their case(s). If two or more Interested Parties wish to address the Sub-Committee the 10 minutes will be divided between them.

- 12. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the Interested Parties.
- 13. The Interested Parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
- 14. The Responsible Authorities will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
- 15. The Applicant will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
- 16. At the conclusion of the hearing all parties, including the Licensing Officer, will be asked to withdraw. The Members of the Sub-Committee, the Legal Adviser and the Committee Services Officer will remain.
- 17. Once the Sub-Committee has reached its decision, all parties will be invited to return. The Sub-Committee's decision, together with the reasons for the decision, will be announced by the Chairman.
- 18. The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the Applicant and those parties who made representations.

Please Note:

- 1. Each application coming before the Licensing Sub-Committee will be treated on its own merits, and the Sub-Committee will take its decision based upon:
 - a) the promotion of the four licensing objectives, as given by the Licensing Act 2003, namely:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm;

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- b) Bromsgrove District Council's Statement of Licensing Policy;
- c) guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003; and
- d) the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2. The Chairman may require any person who in his/her opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the meeting, and may refuse to permit that person to return, or permit him/her to return only on such conditions as the Chairman may specify. However, such person may, before the end of the hearing, submit in writing any information which he/she would have been entitled to have given orally at the meeting had he/she not been required to leave.
- 3. Decisions may be taken in the absence of the Applicant or any other party. All notices and representations received from absent parties will be considered.
- 4. Questioning must not be hostile or intended to unfairly undermine the position of any party.
- 5. Late evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties present.

1. SUMMARY OF PROPOSALS

1.1 To consider an application in the name of Barracuda Pubs and Bars Ltd to vary the premises licence to include the variation in accordance with the submitted plan and to extend the hours permitted for all licensable activities.

The application is brought before the Sub-Committee in view of a relevant representation received from a local resident.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 The Sub-Committee is asked to RESOLVE

After hearing the representation, In relation to The Rousler whether to:

- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
- (b) to reject the whole or part of the application;

Or make any changes deemed necessary to the terms of the Premises Licence in relation to the promotion of the licensing objectives.

3 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The Premises has been licensed with the council as a On licence and under the Licensing Act 2003 transferred from the justice Licence on 24/11/2005
- 3.2 The Licence permits the Sale of Alcohol with consumption off the premises with standard mandatory conditions; a copy of the premises licence is Included at Appendix 1.
- 3.3 The current opening hours of the premises are:

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Thursday to Saturday 10:00am to 02:30am

Sunday to Wednesday 10:00am to 00:00 Midnight

3.4 The Four licensing objectives are:

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder Public Safety
The Prevention of Public Nuisance
The protection of Children from harm

4. KEY ISSUES

- 4.1 On 8th April 2010 Bromsgrove District Council received a variation application form John Gaunt & Partners on behalf of Barracuda Pubs and Clubs Ltd to include on the Licence changes to the plan to cover a proposed roof terrace and to advance the opening hours for non licensable activities to start at 9:00am Monday Sunday.
- 4.2 On the 30th April 2010 John Gaunt & Partners submitted a new application to include the changes to include a roof terrace and to change the hours of licensable activity to start at 08:00am Monday Sunday; a copy of the application can be found at appendix 2.
- 4.3 John Gaunt & Partners where happy and agreed that the application be readvertised and the 28 day consultation period is to finish on the 28th May 2010.
- 4.4 A map of the premises can be found at appendix 3.
- 4.4 On 7th May 2010 Bromsgrove District Council received a representation from a local resident expressing their concerns regarding the new roof terrace and the change of licensing hours; a copy of the representation can be found at appendix 4.
- 4.5 There have been no other representations received from any of the other responsible authorities.

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6. **LEGAL IMPLICATIONS**

- 6.1 Section 34 (3), (4), (5), (6) and (7) of the Licensing Act 2003 provides:
 - (3) Where relevant representations are made, the authority must—
 - (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
 - (b) having regard to the representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
 - (4) The steps are—
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to reject the whole or part of the application; and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.
 - (5) In this section "relevant representations" means representations which—
 - (a) are about the likely effect of the grant of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (b) meet the requirements of subsection (6).
 - (6) The requirements are—
 - (a) that the representations are made by an interested party or responsible authority within the period prescribed under section 17(5)(c) by virtue of section 34(5),
 - (b) that they have not been withdrawn, and
 - (c) in the case of representations made by an interested party (who is not also a responsible authority), that they are not, in the opinion of the relevant licensing authority, frivolous or vexatious.
 - (7) Subsections (2) and (3) are subject to sections 19, 20 and 21 (which require certain mandatory conditions to be included in premises licence).

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Guidance under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003

In considering the application, the licensing authority must consult relevant responsible authorities if there is any doubt about the impact of the variation on the licensing objectives and they need specialist advice, and take their views into account in reaching a decision. For instance, they may need to consult the environmental health officer on an application with possible public nuisance implications. But there is no requirement to consult all responsible authorities on each application and in many cases the licensing authority may be able to make a decision without consultation.

The licensing authority must also consider any relevant representations received from interested parties within the time limit referred to below. As stated earlier in this Guidance, representations are only relevant if they clearly relate to the likely effect of the grant of the variation on the promotion of at least one of the licensing objectives. In the case of minor variations, there is no right to a hearing (as for a full variation or new application), but licensing authorities must take any representations into account in arriving at a decision

- 7.2 The Council's Statement of Licensing Policy applies to this application. This reads: "We will consider every application sent to us, on its individual merits. When we make licensing decisions we will promote:
 - prevention of crime and disorder;
 - protection of public safety;
 - prevention of public nuisance, and
 - protection of children from harm."

Mandatory Conditions

- (a) No supply of alcohol may be made under this Premises Licence at a time when:
 There is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
 At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his/her Personal Licence has been suspended.
- (b) Every Supply of alcohol under this Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- (c) If any person is employed to be responsible for security, protection, screening the suitability of people entering the premises or dealing with conflict in pubs, clubs and other licensed premises open to the public shall be registered with the Security Industry Authority (SIA).
- (d) Where a Premises Licence authorises the exhibition of films, the admission of children to the exhibition of any film is to be restricted in accordance with Section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- (a) General all four licensing objectives
- 1. Barracuda will continue to train staff to the standards required by relevant legislation.
- 2. The premises are risk assessed from time to time in accordance with existing legislation.
- (b) The prevention of crime and disorder
- 3. CCTV shall be installed at the premises. The number and locations of the cameras/monitors and recording equipment to be agreed with the police.
- 4. Recordings shall be stored in a safe environment for a period of time agreed with the Crime Prevention Officer and made available to an authorised officer of the licensing authority or police.
- 5. The system shall be maintained and images stored in accordance with the Data Protection Act and any other relevant legislation relating to the use of the system.
- 6. The requirement for door supervisors will be determined by a management risk assessment. Any door supervisor employed by the company will be licensed under the Private Security Industry Act 2001.
- 7. A drugs policy will be agreed with the police and implemented.
- 8. Toughened glass will be used at the premises where available.
- 9. Drinks promotions will not be permitted allowing unlimited supply of alcohol for a set price.
- 10. A representative of the premises licence holder will actively participate in a Pub Watch scheme where such a scheme exists.
- (c) Public safety
- 11. Plan drawing number X1576 AM01 submitted in support of the application incorporates our client's proposals in respect of the following public safety measures means of escape, fire detection, fire fighting equipment and emergency lighting.
- 12. Barracuda will ensure compliance with all building regulations requirements prior to trading.
- 13. Barracuda will comply with the reasonable requirements of the Fire Officer applicable at the time of completion of the works.
- (d) The prevention of public nuisance
- 14. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the Environmental Health Officer to include matters relating to acoustic measures, noxious smells and refuse.
- 15. Notices asking patrons to leave quietly shall be displayed at the premises.
- (e) The protection of children from harm
- 16. Appropriate steps by management of the premises will be taken to ensure no under age sales will occur.
- 17. Persons under the age of 16 will only be permitted entry to the premises when trading if accompanied by an adult.
- 18. Persons under the age of 18 will not be permitted to play the amusement with prizes machines.





Ref: Application to vary the Premises Licence for The Rousler in Bromsgrove

I am writing with regard to the above and to register an objection to the two variations requested. This is on the following grounds:

1. Variation to extend the licensed area to incorporate the roof terrace

We previously objected to the original planning application for the roof terrace and this further request appears to apply for the lengthening of the drinking hours outside as well as inside the premises.

If this request is granted then it would still generate high levels of noise that will lead to a loss of amenity. We are also concerned that the proposal is likely to lead to noise being emitted from the premises so as to be a statutory nuisance. In the original planning applicant it said (section 5.5) that "There is little, if any, chance of noise and disturbance to noise-sensitive properties being caused by a well-managed use of the proposed terrace area". This is just not true as several drinkers gathered together on an open roof on a summer evening are bound to make a great deal of noise.

Sound carries easily across Crown Close and living on the opposite side of the green we are regularly disturbed by noise from the back of the High Street premises. Rowdy drinkers on their way home, loud music from the dance studio, skateboarders, multi-tone car horns - all of these noises disturb the peace. Crown Close is like a bowl and sound is reflected all around off the back of the high street buildings. It is particularly intrusive at night and in the early hours of the morning when the background noise level drops away. The other noises are transient, and we can live with that. The terrace would produce noise from one place over several hours every night. It would be consistent and regular, and loud. In addition to noise from the terrace, there would be breakout noise from the pub every time the connecting door was opened. The sound would also be projected from first floor level that means it would travel much further than street-level noise. The terrace would be in a direct line to our houses, and bedrooms and we would not be able to ignore it. It would be even worse if customers could use the roof late at night, and worse still if the pub allowed music there. This unnecessary development is bound to be a nuisance to people living nearby and will mean a loss of amenity. It will cause extra noise at quiet times and we believe there are noise pollution and environmental health issues at stake. The noise will stand out, and will significantly affect our lives and the character of the area. Crown Close is a designated Conservation Area.

If the application for the roof terrace is approved, against the wishes of residents, we would urge the council to impose a planning condition, to the effect that the terrace should not be used after 11 p.m. every night. We believe that such a planning condition would be a reasonable, responsible and modest step to take. The pub would have its terrace, the drinkers could smoke, and the residents would have the assurance they would not be unduly disturbed. Imposing a planning condition would help to minimise the detrimental effects on the amenity of the local environment.

2. Advance the opening hours to 0900 hours and extend them by one hour. This is a real concern and, if accepted, would indicate a "couldn't care less attitude" from our council. We thought that the objective was to promote responsible drinking not to encourage it by opening Pub doors just as people roll out of bed. We already have the dubious honour of being the first town in the country to issue a nationwide none drinking ASBO_to one of our residents and have this reported in all the national newspapers. Also this is a Pub that seems happy to allow it's customers to break the law by using the adjoining Cleggs Entry as a toilet. This creates a health and safety issue for the public and no one seems able to take any action to stop it.

We hope that this extension will not be granted.
