LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE (Premises)

HEARING PROCEDURE

- 1. The Chairman will open the hearing and introduce members of the Sub-Committee and officers present.
- 2. The Chairman will ask parties to the proceedings to introduce themselves.
- 3. In the event the Applicant is not represented, the Chairman will remind the Applicant that he/she can be represented by a legal representative at his/her own expense.
- 4. The Licensing Officer, Worcestershire Regulatory Services will present the report.
- 5. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all parties to the proceedings to put any relevant questions to the Licensing Officer.
- 6. The Chairman will invite the Applicant and/or his/her representative to present his/her case and call any witnesses. The Applicant will be allowed a maximum of 10 minutes to present the case.
- 7. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all parties to the proceedings to put any relevant questions to the Applicant and/or his/her representative.
- 8. The Chairman will invite the Responsible Authorities to present their representations. New representations must not be raised. The Responsible Authorities will be allowed a total of 10 minutes to present their case(s). If two or more Responsible Authorities wish to address the Sub-Committee the 10 minutes will be divided between them.
- 9. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all parties to the proceedings to put any relevant questions to the Responsible Authorities.
- 10. All other Parties to the proceedings will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised. A maximum of 10 minutes will be allowed for the Parties to present their case(s). If two or more Parties wish to address the Sub-Committee the 10 minutes will be divided between them.

- 11. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee, the applicant / applicant's representative and the Responsible Authorities to put any relevant questions to the other Parties
- 12. The other Parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
- 13. The Responsible Authorities will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
- 14. The Applicant and/or his/her representative will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
- 15. The Chairman will ask the Legal Advisor if there is any legal advice to be given.
- 16. At the conclusion of the hearing Members of the Sub-Committee, the Legal Advisor and the Democratic Services Officer will withdraw from the meeting room so that the Sub-Committee can reach its decision in private.
- 17. Once the Sub-Committee has reached its decision, all parties will return and the meeting will reconvene. The Sub-Committee's decision, together with the reasons for the decision, will be announced by the Chairman.
- 18. The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the Applicant and those parties who made representations.



Please Note:

- 1. Each application coming before the Licensing Sub-Committee will be treated on its own merits, and the Sub-Committee will take its decision based upon:
 - a) the promotion of the four licensing objectives, as given by the Licensing Act 2003, namely:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm;
 - b) Bromsgrove District Council's Statement of Licensing Policy;
 - c) guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003; and

d) the Licensing Act 2003.

- 2. The Chairman may require any person who in his/her opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the meeting, and may refuse to permit that person to return, or permit him/her to return only on such conditions as the Chairman may specify. However, such person may, before the end of the hearing, submit in writing any information which he/she would have been entitled to have given orally at the meeting had he/she not been required to leave.
- 3. Decisions may be taken in the absence of the Applicant or any other party. All notices and representations received from absent parties will be considered.
- 4. Questioning must not be hostile or intended to unfairly undermine the position of any party.
- 5. Late evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties present.
- 6. In cases where a decision cannot be given at the end of the hearing, the decision will be made within 5 working days.
- 7. An appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the Sub-Committee's decision must be lodged within 21 days of the date on which all parties were notified in writing of the decision of the Licensing Sub-Committee.

1. <u>SUMMARY OF PROPOSALS</u>

1.1 An application under the Licensing Act 2004 ["the Act"] has been made by Moto Hospitality Limited to Bromsgrove District Council ["BDC"] the local licensing authority, for a Premises licence to: 1) sell alcohol off the premises, and 2) provide Late Night Refreshment at the MOTO Frankley Motorway Service Area ["MSA"] (North), M5 Motorway, Illey Lane, Birmingham, B32 4AR.

An objection to the application in relation to the sale of alcohol has been made by the local licensing authority and the matter is brought before the Licensing Sub-Committee for its consideration.

2. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

2.1 The Sub-Committee is asked to RESOLVE

whether or not, having regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the four licensing objectives; the Guidance issued under section 182 of the Act; BDC's Statement of Licensing Policy, the applicant's proposed Operating Schedule and relevant representations made by responsible authorities;

- 1) To grant or refuse the application, as shown in the application form attached at Appendix 1 to the report.
- 2) If the Licensing Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application;
 - a) To attach relevant Mandatory Conditions; and
 - b) To consider, with due regard to the statutory licensing objectives and the relevant representation received, whether to attach any appropriate conditions.

3. KEY ISSUES

Financial Implications

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3.1 The Statutory Fee of £635.00 has been paid, and the application has been duly advertised in accordance to the requirements of the Act. Should the application be refused by the Sub-committee, there is a right of appeal to Magistrates Court. The Magistrates may make an order for costs on an appeal.

Legal Implications: General

- 3.2 In considering the application, the Sub-Committee should have regard to the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and in considering a decision should also determine an application with regard to the National Guidance issued under s182 of the Act; BDC's Statement of Licensing Policy and the promotion of the licensing objectives which are:
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm.
- 3.3 The Sub-Committee must also have regard to the representations made and the evidence presented at the hearing.
- 3.4 The Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary to comply with the Act and for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

(a) Grant the application as asked
(b) Modify or impose conditions on the licence, by altering or omitting or adding to them.
(c) Reject the application

- (c) Reject the application.
- 3.5 Any modification or imposition of conditions must be necessary to promote the licensing objectives.
- 3.6 The Human Rights Act 1998 incorporates human rights under the European Convention into English law. Article 6 provides that, in the determination of a person's civil rights, everyone is entitled to a fair and public hearing.

Legal Implications: Particular to the Application:

3.7 An application for a new Premises Licence for Moto Frankley Service Area (North), M5 Motorway, Illey Lane, Birmingham, B32 4AR made by Moto Hospitality Limited was received by Bromsgrove District Council on the 19th September 2014 for the:

Sale of alcohol off the Premises: Monday to Sunday 07:00 – 23:00. Late Night Refreshment: Monday to Sunday 23:00 – 05:00.

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A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix 1**.

3.8 A representation has been received from Bromsgrove District Council, in its capacity as the Local Licensing Authority, on the basis that the premises would appear to be "excluded premises" as defined in s176 and accordingly should not be licensed for the sale of alcohol.

A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix 2

NOTE: No objection has been raised in relation to the granting of a premises licence for the provision of late night refreshment

- 3. 9 In relation to the sale of alcohol, s 176 Licensing Act 2003 provides:
 - "No premises license, club certificate or temporary event notice has the effect to authorise the sale by retail or supply of alcohol on or from excluded premises.
 - (2) In this section "excluded premises" means-.

(a) premises situated on land acquired or appropriated by a special road authority, and for the time being used, for the provision of facilities to be used in connection with the use of a special road provided for the use of traffic of class I (with or without other classes); or

(b) premises used primarily as a garage or which form part of premises which are primarily so used.

- (3) [not relevant]
- (4) For the purposes of this section—
 - (a) "special road" and "special road authority" have the same meaning as in the Highways Act 1980 (c. 66), except that "special road" includes a trunk road to which (by virtue of paragraph 3 of Schedule 23 to that Act) the provisions of that Act apply as if the road were a special road,
 - (b) "class I" means class I in Schedule 4 to the Highways Act 1980 as varied from time to time by an order under section 17 of that Act, but if that Schedule is amended by such an order so as to add to it a further class of traffic, the order may adapt the reference in subsection (2)(a) to traffic of class I so as to take account of the additional class

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- 3.10 In submitting its application for the sale of alcohol to the local licensing authority, for consideration under the Licensing Act 2003, the applicant has indicated that it considers that the premises are not "excluded premises" for the purposes of the Act."
- 3.11 The BDC representation is that as the site comprises an "excluded premises", it would be inappropriate for the Sub-Committee to grant a licence for the sale of alcohol in relation to them.
- 3.12 Whether the application site comprises "excluded premises" for the purposes of the Act is part of the determination to be made by the Sub-Committee and whether to consider granting a licence for the sale of alcohol under the Licensing Act 2003, and if so on what terms.
- 3.13 Prior to 1992, the Department of Transport had responsibility for developing MSAs: acquiring land, funding construction and leasing the completed sites to operating companies. This is the status of the Frankley Motorway Services Areas. The site was sold to Granada in 1995 and to the applicant in 1999.
- 3.14 Since1992, government policy has been that the private sector should acquire MSA sites and seek planning consent from local planning authorities to develop and open MSAs
- 3.15 The applicant takes the view that since the sites are now in their private ownership, they qualify for consideration by the local licensing authority to be licensed under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 3.16 The BDC objection is based on the premise that as the site was originally acquired by a special road authority its status is that of "excluded premises" for the purposes of the Licensing Act, and that being sold into the private sector since then does not alter that status.
- 3.17 In 2012 the Home Office carried out consultation on reviewing the prohibition on the sale of alcohol from MSAs but no proposals have as yet been forthcoming.

Service/Operational Implications

3.18 The Licensing Authority is required to comply with the statutory timescales for arranging hearings under the Licensing Act 2003.

Customer / Equalities and Diversity Implications

3.19 The Licensing Sub-Committee will ensure it has regard to the desirability of exercising its functions with regard to the need to

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eliminate discrimination and to increase equality of opportunity. Applications received will be treated in accordance with BDC's Equal Opportunities policy.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

Moto Hospitality operate amenity areas through the country to include the provision of the sale of alcohol. Moto Hospitality have a significant amount of data to support the provision of such amenities and the positive impact upon their customers.

The promotion of the four licensing objectives at their other units confirms not only to robust and an informed approach to the retail of alcohol but also demonstrates a unique knowledge of the operation of Service Areas and the requirements of customers who frequent them.

Issues identified in previous applications relating to the provision of alcohol under the Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol) Act 1985 have been considered at all of the areas currently supplying alcohol through Marks & Spencer PLC. There has never been an issue in respect of consumption of alcohol in motor vehicles travelling to football matches from customers who have visited Moto Service Areas as advised by any Police Force. Whilst the operators are aware of their responsibilities in respect of the Act, there is currently no evidence that would suggest that those wishing to attend football matches and using motor vehicles also use Moto Service Areas to obtain alcohol.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- 1. The siting of the CCTV system will be agreed with Bedfordshire Police prior to installation and will comply with that agreement at all times.
- The system is to be operational at all times when licensed activities are being carried out. The system is to be adequately maintained and be capable of downloading recorded material onto removable media.
- CCTV footage will be made secure and retained for a minimum of 28 days. CCTV footage to be supplied to the Police and authorities officers of Central Bedfordshire Council upon request.
- 4. At all times when the premises are open to the public there will be a member of staff on duty who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system and who is able to download immediately any footage as requested by the Police or an officer from Bromsgrove District Council.

c) Public safety

- 1. Fire safety measures and procedures are in operation in accordance with Fire Safety Regulations.
- 2. Provision will be made for the disabled to ensure safe evacuation in the event of fire or other emergency and general access.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- Procedures will be established to prevent noise disturbance from deliveries and all plant and machinery.
- 2. Measures will be in place to ensure the proper disposal of all waste.

e) The protection of children from harm

- 1. Staff will be trained to ensure that in case of any doubt whether a purchaser is over the age of 18, sale will be refused unless valid identification is produced.
- 2. Till prompts will remind staff at point of sale of alcohol to ensure the purchaser is over 18.
- 3. All displays of alcohol will be appropriately ticketed to advise purchasers that it is an offence for those under 18 to purchase alcohol.
- 4. Till points will be monitored by the digital CCTV system.
- 5. An Age Challenge Scheme with an Age Challenge of not less than 25 years is in force for persons who appear less than 25.





I am writing on behalf of Bromsgrove District Council in its capacity as the licensing authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to make representations in respect of the above application for the grant of a premises licence.

The application seeks authorisation for the use of the premises for the sale by retail of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment. The licensing authority is concerned that granting the application would have an adverse effect on the promotion of the licensing objective of prevention of crime and disorder for the following reasons.

The licensing authority has received information from the Highways Agency that suggests that the premises are situated on land acquired or appropriated by a special road authority, and for the time being used, for the provision of facilities to be used in connection with the use of a special road provided for the use of traffic of class I (with or without other classes). As such the premises would appear to be "excluded premises" as defined by section 176 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Section 176 (1) of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

"No premises licence, club premises certificate or temporary event notice has effect to authorise the sale by retail or supply of alcohol on or from excluded premises"

Therefore if a premises licence were granted, and alcohol sold at the premises in reliance on that licence, offences would be committed under section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, which states:

A person commits an offence if-

- (a) he carries on or attempts to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation, or
- (b) he knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on.

The licensing authority therefore believes that to grant the part of the application which seeks authorisation for the use of the premises for the sale by retail of alcohol, would be to encourage the commission of serious offences which carry heavy maximum penalties. For this reason the licensing authority objects to the granting of a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises which would authorise the use of the premises for the sale by retail of alcohol.

For the sake of clarity, no objection is raised in relation to the granting of a premises licence authorising the use of the premises for the provision of late night refreshment.

If the applicant can produce evidence to satisfy the licensing authority that the premises are not excluded premises, this representation may be withdrawn.

1. <u>SUMMARY OF PROPOSALS</u>

1.1 An application under the Licensing Act 2004 ["the Act"] has been made by Moto Hospitality Limited to Bromsgrove District Council ["BDC"] the local licensing authority, for a Premises licence to: 1) sell alcohol off the premises, and 2) provide Late Night Refreshment at the MOTO Frankley Motorway Service Area ["MSA"] (South), M5 Motorway, Illey Lane, Birmingham, B32 4AR.

An objection to the application in relation to the sale of alcohol has been made by the local licensing authority and the matter is brought before the Licensing Sub-Committee for its consideration.

2. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

2.1 The Sub-Committee is asked to RESOLVE

whether or not, having regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the four licensing objectives; the Guidance issued under section 182 of the Act; BDC's Statement of Licensing Policy, the applicant's proposed Operating Schedule and relevant representations made by responsible authorities;

- 1) To grant or refuse the application, as shown in the application form attached at Appendix 1 to the report.
- 2) If the Licensing Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application;
 - a) To attach relevant Mandatory Conditions; and
 - b) To consider, with due regard to the statutory licensing objectives and the relevant representation received, whether to attach any appropriate conditions.

3.1 The Statutory Fee of £635.00 has been paid, and the application has been duly advertised in accordance to the requirements of the Act. Should the application be refused by the Sub-committee, there is a right of appeal to Magistrates Court. The Magistrates may make an order for costs on an appeal.

3.8 A representation has been received from Bromsgrove District Council, in its capacity as the local licensing authority, on the basis that the premises would appear to be "excluded premises" as defined in s176 and accordingly should not be licensed for the sale of alcohol.

- 3. 9 In relation to the sale of alcohol, s 176 Licensing Act 2003 provides:

(a) premises situated on land acquired or appropriated by a special road authority, and for the time being used, for the provision of facilities to be used in connection with the use of a special road provided for the use of traffic of class I (with or without other classes); or

(b) premises used primarily as a garage or which form part of premises which are primarily so used.

- (4) For the purposes of this section—
 - (a) "special road" and "special road authority" have the same meaning as in the Highways Act 1980 (c. 66), except that "special road" includes a trunk road to which (by virtue of paragraph 3 of Schedule 23 to that Act) the provisions of that Act apply as if the road were a special road,
 - (b) "class I" means class I in Schedule 4 to the Highways Act 1980 as varied from time to time by an order under section 17 of that Act, but if that Schedule is amended by such an order so as to add to it a further class of traffic, the order may adapt the reference in subsection (2)(a) to traffic of class I so as to take account of the additional class

- 3.10 In submitting its application for the sale of alcohol at the premises, for consideration under the Licensing Act 2003, the applicant has indicated that it considers that the premises are not "excluded premises" for the purposes of the Act.
- 3.11 The BDC representation is that as the site comprises an "excluded premises", it would be inappropriate for the Sub-Committee to licence them for the sale of alcohol.
- 3.12 Whether the application site comprises "excluded premises" for the purposes of the Act is part of the determination to be made by the Sub-Committee and whether to consider granting a licence for the sale of alcohol under the Licensing Act 2003, and if so on what terms.
- 3.13 Prior to 1992, the Department of Transport had responsibility for developing MSAs: acquiring land, funding construction and leasing the completed sites to operating companies. This is the status of the Frankley Motorway Services Areas. The site was sold to Granada in 1995 and to the applicant in 1999.
- 3.14 Since1992, government policy has been that the private sector should acquire MSA sites and seek planning consent from local planning authorities to develop and operate them.
- 3.15 The BDC objection is based on the fact that s176 excludes premises from being able to sell alcohol if they were originally acquired by a special road authority regardless of whether they have entered the private sector since then, as in the case of the Frankley MSA
- 3.16 The applicant takes the view that since the sites are now in their private ownership, they qualify for consideration by the local licensing authority to be licensed under the Licensing Act 2003, even if not wholly acquired and developed by a private owner since 1992.
- 3.17 In 2012 the Home Office carried out consultation on reviewing the prohibition on the sale of alcohol from MSAs but no proposals have as yet been forthcoming.

Service/Operational Implications

3.18 The Licensing Authority is required to comply with the statutory timescales for arranging hearings under the Licensing Act 2003.

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

Moto Hospitality operate amenity areas through the country to include the provision of the sale of alcohol. Moto Hospitality have a significant amount of data to support the provision of such amenities and the positive impact upon their customers.

The promotion of the four licensing objectives at their other units confirms not only to robust and an informed approach to the retail of alcohol but also demonstrates a unique knowledge of the operation of Service Areas and the requirements of customers who frequent them.

Issues identified in previous applications relating to the provision of alcohol under the Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol) Act 1985 have been considered at all of the areas currently supplying alcohol through Marks & Spencer PLC. There has never been an issue in respect of consumption of alcohol in motor vehicles travelling to football matches from customers who have visited Moto Service Areas as advised by any Police Force. Whilst the operators are aware of their responsibilities in respect of the Act, there is currently no evidence that would suggest that those wishing to attend football matches and using motor vehicles also use Moto Service Areas to obtain alcohol.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- The siting of the CCTV system will be agreed with Bedfordshire Police prior to installation and will comply with that agreement at all times.
- The system is to be operational at all times when licensed activities are being carried out. The system is to be adequately maintained and be capable of downloading recorded material onto removable media.
- CCTV footage will be made secure and retained for a minimum of 28 days. CCTV footage to be supplied to the Police and authorities officers of Central Bedfordshire Council upon request.
- 4. At all times when the premises are open to the public there will be a member of staff on duty who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system and who is able to download immediately any footage as requested by the Police or an officer from Central Bedfordshire Council.

c) Public safety



I

I am writing on behalf of Bromsgrove District Council in its capacity as the licensing authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to make representations in respect of the above application for the grant of a premises licence.

The application seeks authorisation for the use of the premises for the sale by retail of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment. The licensing authority is concerned that granting the application would have an adverse effect on the promotion of the licensing objective of prevention of crime and disorder for the following reasons.

The licensing authority has received information from the Highways Agency that suggests that the premises are situated on land acquired or appropriated by a special road authority, and for the time being used, for the provision of facilities to be used in connection with the use of a special road provided for the use of traffic of class I (with or without other classes). As such the premises would appear to be "excluded premises" as defined by section 176 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Section 176 (1) of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

"No premises licence, club premises certificate or temporary event notice has effect to authorise the sale by retail or supply of alcohol on or from excluded premises"

Therefore if a premises licence were granted, and alcohol sold at the premises in reliance on that licence, offences would be committed under section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, which states:

A person commits an offence if-

- (a) he carries on or attempts to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation, or
- (b) he knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on.

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The licensing authority therefore believes that to grant the part of the application which seeks authorisation for the use of the premises for the sale by retail of alcohol, would be to encourage the commission of serious offences which carry heavy maximum penalties. For this reason the licensing authority objects to the granting of a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises which would authorise the use of the premises for the sale by retail of alcohol.

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For the sake of clarity, no objection is raised in relation to the granting of a premises licence authorising the use of the premises for the provision of late night refreshment.

If the applicant can produce evidence to satisfy the licensing authority that the premises are not excluded premises, this representation may be withdrawn.
