HEARING PROCEDURE

- 1. The Chairman will open the hearing and introduce Members of the Sub-Committee and officers present.
- 2. The Chairman will ask parties to the proceedings to introduce themselves.
- 3. In the event the Applicant is not represented, the Chairman will remind the Applicant that he/she can be represented by a legal representative at his/her own expense.
- 4. The Licensing Officer, Worcestershire Regulatory Services will present the report.
- 5. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all parties to the proceedings to put any relevant questions to the Licensing Officer.
- 6. The Chairman will invite the Applicant and/or his/her representative to present his/her case and call any witnesses. The Applicant will be allowed a maximum of 10 minutes to present the case.
- 7. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all parties to the proceedings to put any relevant questions to the Applicant and/or his/her representative.
- 8. The Chairman will invite the Responsible Authorities to present their representations. New representations must not be raised. The Responsible Authorities will be allowed a total of 10 minutes to present their case(s). If two or more Responsible Authorities wish to address the Sub-Committee the 10 minutes will be divided between them.
- 9. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all parties to the proceedings to put any relevant questions to the Responsible Authorities.
- 10. All other Parties to the proceedings will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised. A maximum of 10 minutes will be allowed for the Parties to present their case(s). If two or more Parties wish to address the Sub-Committee the 10 minutes will be divided between them.

- 1. Each application coming before the Licensing Sub-Committee will be treated on its own merits, and the Sub-Committee will take its decision based upon:
 - a) the promotion of the four licensing objectives, as given by the Licensing Act 2003, namely:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm;

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- b) Bromsgrove District Council's Statement of Licensing Policy;
- c) guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003; and
- d) the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2. The Chairman may require any person who in his/her opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the meeting, and may refuse to permit that person to return, or permit him/her to return only on such conditions as the Chairman may specify. However, such person may, before the end of the hearing, submit in writing any information which he/she would have been entitled to have given orally at the meeting had he/she not been required to leave.
- 3. Decisions may be taken in the absence of the Applicant or any other party. All notices and representations received from absent parties will be considered.
- 4. Questioning must not be hostile or intended to unfairly undermine the position of any party.
- 5. Late evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties present.

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application for variation of the premises licence in respect of the premises below:

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 On 12 June 2015 an application was received from Elmsvyne Leisure Ltd for variation of the premises licence in respect of

- 2.2 The application contained all the requisite documentation including the fee.
- 2.3 It can be confirmed that the application has been advertised in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and associated regulations and that the application has also been served on all responsible authorities.
- 2.4 The applicant is applying for the following variations to their existing licence:

 To extend the hours for Indoor sporting, Live/Recorded Music (indoors & outdoors),

 Performance of Dance (indoors): Fridays, Saturdays and Bank holidays 10:00 –

 04:00.

Late Night Refreshments: Fridays, Saturdays and Bank holidays 23:00 – 04:00. Sale of Alcohol: Fridays, Saturdays and Bank holidays (Indoors) 10:00 – 03:30.

3. REPRESENTATIONS

5. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to the promotion of the licensing objectives which are:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance;
 - the protection of children from harm.
- In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 5.3 The Sub-Committee must also have regard to the representations made and the evidence it hears.
- 5.4 The Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - (a) Grant the application as requested
 - (b) Modify the conditions of the licence, by altering or omitting or adding to them.
 - (c) Reject the application in whole or in part.
- 5.5 The Sub-Committee is asked to note that it may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.
- 5.6 All parties to the hearing will be notified of the Sub-Committee's decision in writing within five working days of the conclusion of the hearing.
- 5.7 Any party aggrieved by a decision taken by the Sub-Committee may appeal against the decision to a Magistrates' Court within 21 days of being notified of the decision in writing.

Please describe briefly the nature of the proposed variation (Please see guidance note 2) The Dog & Pheasant is a town centre public house, typically late night drinking only, and we currently only trade on a Friday and Saturday evening due to the decline in trade within the town centre during the recession. Since 'The Grove', another town centre pub in close proximity was granted a late license, the majority of our trade now occurs after 01:00 hours, which means our window of opportunity to successfully trade is limited. We would like to have the option to continue to trade on busy nights at the weekends, Bank Holidays and special events to trade until 03.30 hours and to close the premises at 04:00 hours. On average we successful submit a temporary license to trade for these hours which is not only time consuming for us to process, but other authorities involved and costly. We are therefore requesting a variation to our existing license to enable us to be flexible with the opening hours for weekends and Bank Holidays. Although we currently do not trade mid-week, we still wish to retain our current hours and licensable activities we hold a license for.



I object in the most strongest terms possible to the potential changes in opening times & the serving of alcohol times.

We are already subject to significant noise pollution, the use of our premises as a convenient "toilet" & petty vandalism as a direct result of this individual establishment. Since the adjacent nightclub has been taken under new ownership in the last 2 years or so the situation has improved slightly – due mostly to the presence of their staff in Worcester Road. It is my belief that extending the hours of opening/alcohol purchase potential will have a significantly detrimental effect on the current status quo. Re: Objection to extended hours of trade and playing of music at The Dog and Pheasant Worcester Road Bromsgrove

We write as the owners of Love 2 Love Bromsgrove, and also represent Era Leisure 1 Ltd and the premises licence holder. We would respectfully point out that if the application is approved then the Dog and Pheasant will be able to operate within the conditions of the extended licence. The fact that they make claims that it is for occasional use should not have a bearing on the grant.

Our objections are as follows:-

Dispersal.

By local agreement, Love 2 Love closes at 3.30 am Friday and Saturdays although we are licensed until 4am

This is done in recognition of the lack of Taxis at that time of the morning, police resource, and that there is sufficient time for customers of the Dog and Pheasant to have dispersed after their closure, currently 2.30am on both nights.

The capacity of the Dog and Pheasant is 375 and our capacity is 625 both include customers and staff.

If a grant of 4am was given to the Dog and Pheasant, we would be forced to stay open until 4am also, which gives a possible 1000 people discharging into the streets from two venues less than 25 meters apart.

It is our belief that allowing this situation to arise contravenes two of the licensing objectives as laid down in the 2003 act. They are Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance.

Furthermore, the Istanbul Kebab takeaway closes at 4am as their licence permits. This works well at the moment as customers leaving the Dog and Pheasant at 2.30am do so and choose to eat or get a taxi home. Either way the dwell time spent eating slows dispersal in a positive way as taxis begin to return to the rank to service customers who have chosen to eat. At 3.30am when we close, a similar situation exists and by 4am The Istanbul closes and Worcester Road has only a few revellers left behind.

Disorder.

It is easy to imagine with consideration to the above how even 500 people in Worcester Road at 4am could create Disorder and Public Nuisance issues for the following reasons

- 1. The amount of noise generated by that number of people in the street at that time.
- 2. The Istanbul takeaway will be closed, but will have the impression of being open as the lights will be on and staff will be present carrying out cleaning duties.
- 3. There will be less taxis available for customers to get home so the taxi queue will become disorderly and customers will try and" intercept" taxis before they return to the rank, or queue jumping will ensue stimulating acts of violence.
- 4. It is well known that taxi drivers will not return to a disorderly rank or where they feel threatened which is likely to be the case.
- 5. There will be distinctly two different types of customer in close proximity to each other which again can create acts of violence.

In summary we believe that the area of Worcester road between Love 2 Love, the Dog and Pheasant, The Istanbul Take away and the head of the taxi rank will become an area of violence, Public disorder, Public Nuisance, and an issue of Public safety, which are three of the four licensing objectives which will be breached should the application be granted. It is also our belief that Worcester Road will probably not clear of revellers until 5am or later causing huge problems for local residents who are entitled to a decent night's sleep at the very least.

Serving and consumption of Alcohol until 3.30am.

We only see that the serving of alcohol to 3.30am drives the need for a 4am closure time and therefore supports our objection further.

Music played outside and in until 4am.

Whilst not affecting us directly it does have an impact. We regularly receive complaints from neighbours about the volume of the music. On every occasion we have been able to prove that actually it is the music from the Dog and Pheasant which is causing concern This is substantiated by the fact since our ownership for the past three years we have only received complaints pre 2am and one after which was when the Dog and Pheasant had an event on. Given that we trade until 3.30 and have not had any complaints relating to us means that we are not causing a nuisance throughout a trading session.

Other points for consideration.

- 1. The reason given for the extended hours is accommodate regular functions and not use up the TENS . The events are held upstairs in B61 so why not apply for a variation to that room.
- 2. The Love 2 Love smoking area is restricted to 30 people maximum no alcohol no music and no seating, surrounded by a 15ft sound dreading wall and entranced via a double door sound lobby. It was clearly recognised by the authorities that residents should be well protected from noise and nuisance. We therefore would expect that any request which impacts on any neighbours be treated as stringently.
- 3. The crime figures in Worcester road have gone down. This is we believe down to the fact that we marshal the taxi queue as and when required.

4. At the end of each session we check nearby doorways for any unexpected deposits and clean as necessary and clear/ tidy the street generally in conjunction with Istanbul Takeaway.

Finally, because of the balance of permitted hours in Worcester Road, and the co operation of all in recognising issues and dealing with them, Bromsgrove night life is slowly improving as it has started to shed a dreadful reputation of violence and drunken antisocial behaviour.

A grant of a 4am licence to the Dog & Pheasant will change the dynamics of Worcester Road at night to the detriment of everything done by everyone involved in the turn round.

On this basis and with due consideration to all of the above we ask the application is refused.
