INFORMATION FOR THE PUBLIC

Access to Information

The Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985 widened the rights of press and public to attend Local Authority meetings and to see certain documents. Recently the Freedom of Information Act 2000 has further broadened these rights, and limited exemptions under the 1985 Act.

- You can attend all Council, Cabinet and Committee/Board meetings, except for any part of the meeting when the business would disclose confidential or “exempt” information.
- You can inspect agenda and public reports at least five days before the date of the meeting.
- You can inspect minutes of the Council, Cabinet and its Committees/Boards for up to six years following a meeting.
- You can have access, upon request, to the background papers on which reports are based for a period of up to six years from the date of the meeting. These are listed at the end of each report.
- An electronic register stating the names and addresses and electoral areas of all Councillors with details of the membership of all Committees etc. is available on our website.
- A reasonable number of copies of agendas and reports relating to items to be considered in public will be made available to the public attending meetings of the Council, Cabinet and its Committees/Boards.
- You have access to a list specifying those powers which the Council has delegated to its Officers indicating also the titles of the Officers concerned, as detailed in the Council’s Constitution, Scheme of Delegation.

LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE (Premises)

HEARING PROCEDURE

1. The Chairman will open the hearing and introduce Members of the Sub-Committee and officers present.
2. The Chairman will ask parties to the proceedings to introduce themselves.
3. In the event the Applicant is not represented, the Chairman will remind the Applicant that he/she can be represented by a legal representative at his/her own expense.
4. The Licensing Officer, Worcestershire Regulatory Services will present the report.
5. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all parties to the proceedings to put any relevant questions to the Licensing Officer.
6. The Chairman will invite the Applicant and/or his/her representative to present his/her case and call any witnesses. The Applicant will be allowed a maximum of 10 minutes to present the case.
7. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all parties to the proceedings to put any relevant questions to the Applicant and/or his/her representative.
8. The Chairman will invite the Responsible Authorities to present their representations. New representations must not be raised. The Responsible Authorities will be allowed a total of 10 minutes to present their case(s). If two or more Responsible Authorities wish to address the Sub-Committee the 10 minutes will be divided between them.
9. The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all parties to the proceedings to put any relevant questions to the Responsible Authorities.
10. All other Parties to the proceedings will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised. A maximum of 10 minutes will be allowed for the Parties to present their case(s). If two or more Parties wish to address the Sub-Committee the 10 minutes will be divided between them.

11. **The Chairman will invite Members of the Sub-Committee, the applicant / applicant's representative and the Responsible Authorities to put any relevant questions to the other Parties**
12. **The other Parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.**
13. **The Responsible Authorities will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.**
14. **The Applicant and/or his/her representative will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.**
15. **The Chairman will ask the Legal Advisor if there is any legal advice to be given.**
16. **At the conclusion of the hearing Members of the Sub-Committee, the Legal Advisor and the Democratic Services Officer will withdraw from the meeting room so that the Sub-Committee can reach its decision in private**

However, such person may, before the end of the hearing, submit in writing any information which he/she would have been entitled to have given orally at the meeting had he/she not been required to leave.***

- 2.1 On 20 January 2016 an application was received from Mr Jack Bayley for grant of a premises licence in respect of:

2.2 The application contained all the requisite documentation including the fee and a plan of the premises. The plan of the premises can be seen at **Appendix 2**.

2.3 It can be confirmed that the application has been advertised in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and associated regulations and that the application has also been served on all responsible authorities.

2.4 The applicant is applying for the following licensable activities:-

3.2 A total of three emails were received making representations in respect of the application. The emails have all been sent from the operators of other local businesses in Worcester Road. The representations are attached to this report at **Appendix 3**.

3.3 The representations include concerns about noise and disturbance emanating from music being played at the premises. Concerns are also raised about the potential for noise and anti-social behaviour arising from customers of the premises.

- 5.2 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 5.3 The Sub-Committee must also have regard to the representations made and the evidence it hears.
- 5.4 The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
- (a) Grant the application as requested
 - (b) Modify the conditions of the licence, by altering or omitting or adding to them.
 - (c) Reject the application in whole or in part.
- 5.5 The Sub-Committee is asked to note that it may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.
- 5.6 All parties to the hearing will be notified of the Sub-Committee's decision in writing within five working days of the conclusion of the hearing.

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5.7 Any party aggrieved by a decision taken by the Sub-Committee may appeal against the decision to a Magistrates' Court within 21 days of being notified of the decision in writing.

5.8 The hearing should be conducted in accordance with the agreed procedure.

Bayley's of Bromsgrove proposes to sell a range of high end liquor and craft beer within Bromsgrove's town centre, from a shop on the Worcester Road. In addition to the alcoholic products the business intends to sell a small range of specialist coffee's and other hot drinks during it's opening hours. The shop will provide a range of products being sold primarily to take away and consumed off the premises. The application does include the sale of alcohol on site and a number of other licensable activities, this is mainly to give the public a chance to experience the product range in the correct environment, for example a customer may wish to taste a certain style of craft beer before taking away a full selection. The set up of the shop is not that of a bar or restaurant so does not intend to trade as one, please see floor plan. The shop is wishing to trade between the hours of 08.00 - 00.00, Monday to Sunday. There will be a limited number of seating on site for those who decide to reside within the premises. The application also includes provision to play recorded music on site, this is as back ground music and will be amplified to a level that reflects that, at no point will the music be amplified to a level that causes a public nuisance. The application also includes the provision to play films on the premises, this will be for small independent film releases, cult films and other films that carry a local interest. The premises will operate the Challenge 25 policy at all times and will have sufficient CCTV in operation, location of CCTV to be chosen by local law enforcement.

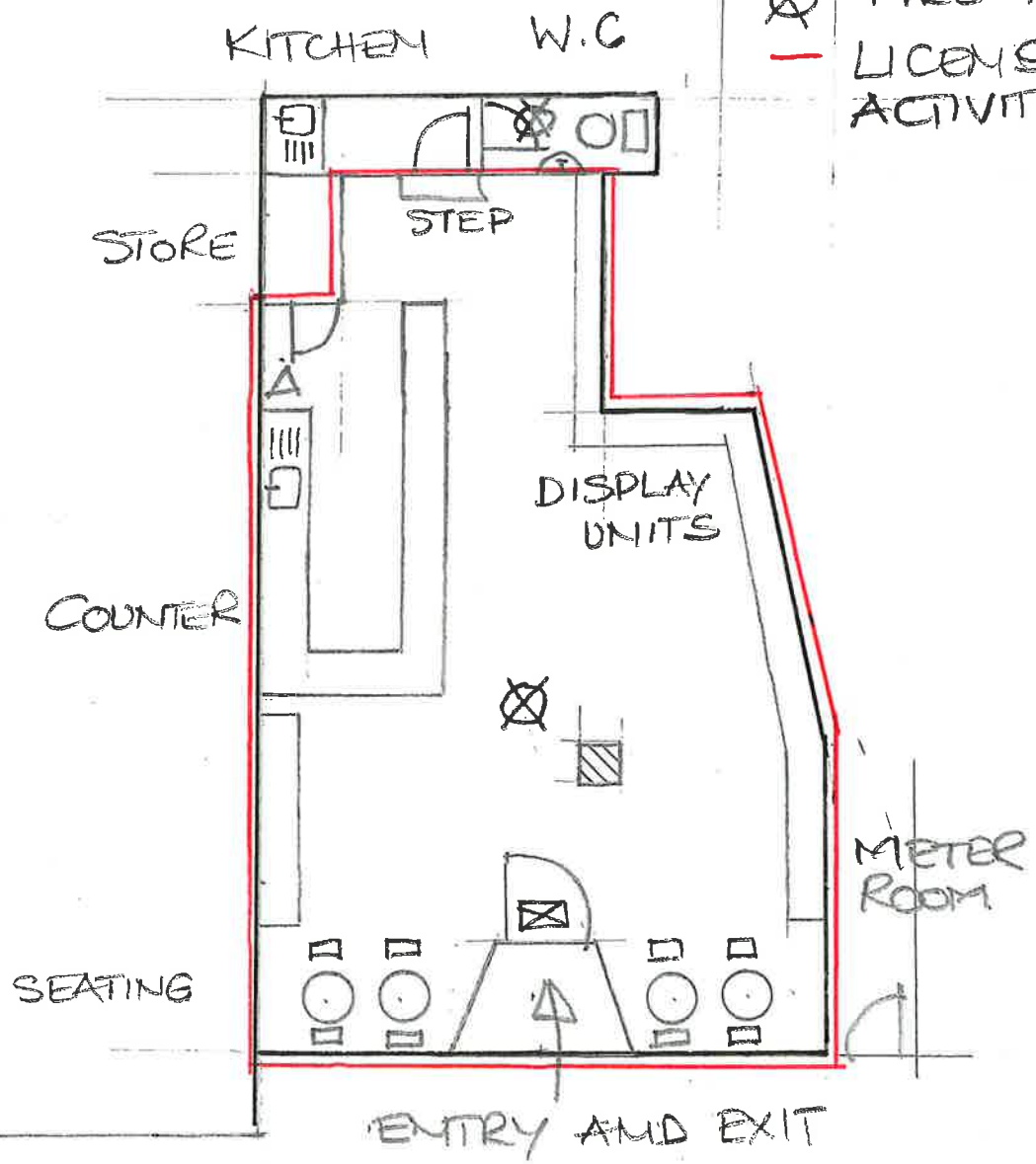

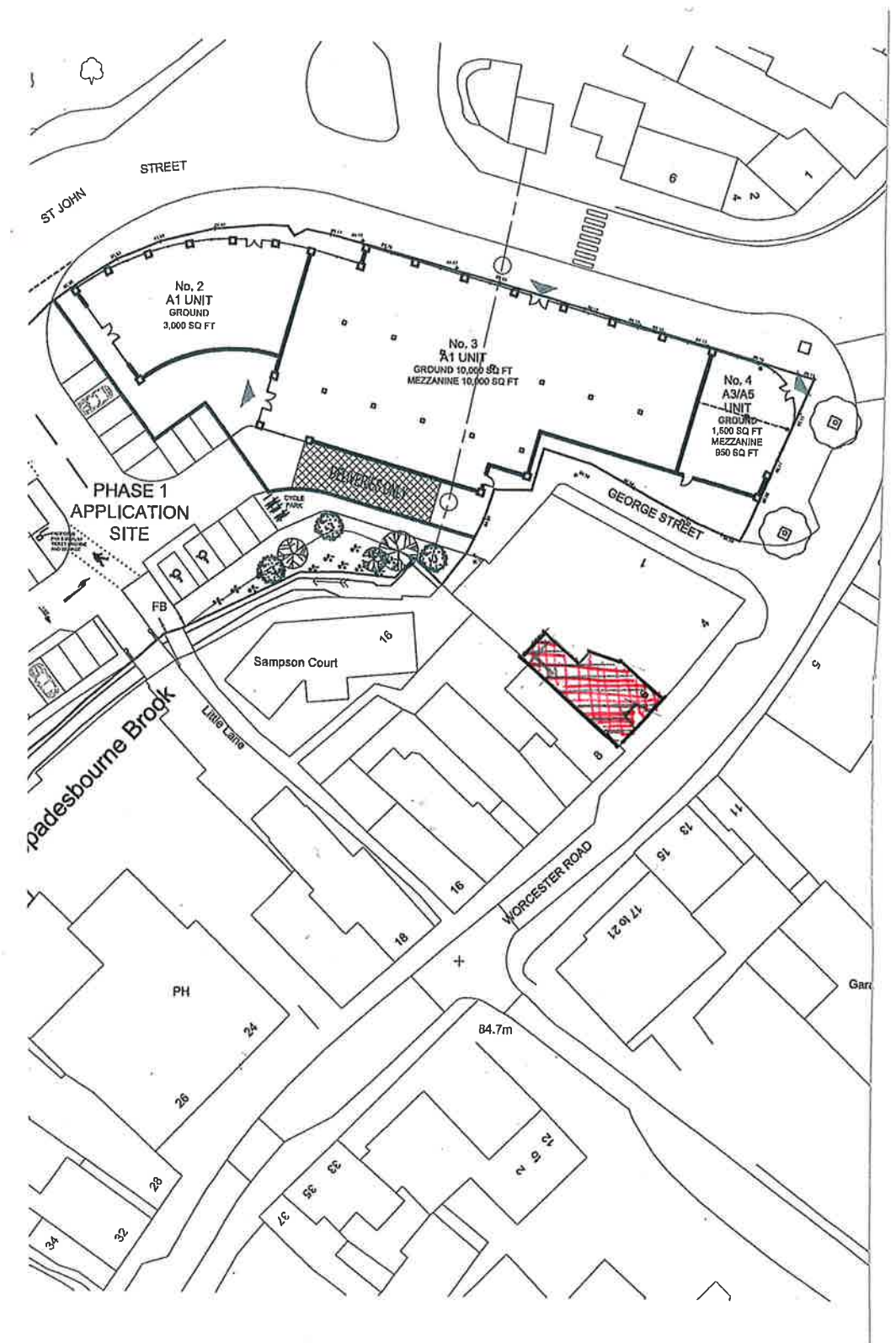

May I refer to the above Application.

We have a Music School directly opposite the above building, teaching a large range of disciplines.

We have approximately 180 students a week of which the majority are of school age, ranging from 6 years old. A number of students walk to our premises straight from the local schools and then walk home.

The majority of our tutors are female, and the last to leave has to lock up and set the alarms, then walk to the public car parks.

Granting a License as per the Application would allow the showing of films, playing of music and the consumption of alcohol from 08.00 to 00.00. This would result in a continuous stream of customers, who may have been drinking all

day, on the opposite footpath as there is no rear access to the property for those wishing to smoke. This would lead to an intimidating presence for the youngsters, parents and staff when entering or leaving the building.

It could also impact on the teaching aspect of the school as all the teaching rooms have windows overlooking the street. Any loud or raucous behaviour would also be intimidating to the children."We have had previous experiences with disruption and intimidation of this type when unsociable elements were housed in the adjacent property with resultant police raids, anti-social behaviour outside the front door etc. It is very worrying and concerning to both the students and staff.
