1. SUMMARY OF PROPOSALS

To ask Members to consider the responses received during the consultation on a draft revised Statement of Licensing Policy and to recommend to Council that the revised Statement of Licensing Policy attached at Appendix 2 be approved and published with effect from 1st May 2014.

2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

To recommend to Council that the revised Statement of Licensing Policy attached at Appendix 2 be approved and published with effect from 1st May 2014.

3. KEY ISSUES

Financial Implications

3.1 The cost of the consultation exercise was met by existing budgets held by Worcestershire Regulatory Services.

Legal Implications

3.2 The Council has a statutory duty to have a Statement of Licensing Policy and to keep its Policy under review. It is important that the Statement of Licensing Policy provides an open and transparent policy regarding the Council's functions under the Licensing Act 2003. The Statement of Licensing Policy forms an essential part of the decision making process for licensing applications.

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Service / Operational Implications

- 3.3 Bromsgrove District Council's existing statement of Licensing Policy was published on 7th January 2011
- 3.4 Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 currently requires Licensing Authorities to review Statements of Licensing Policy every five years, and therefore a reviewed Statement must be approved by Council and published no later than 7th January 2016.
- 3.5 Whilst the Council are not legally required to review the Statement of Licensing Policy for another 2 years, it is felt desirable to review the Policy at this stage as a result of the large number of changes to the legislation and statutory guidance since the existing Policy was published in January 2011.
- 3.6 Section 5 (3) of the Licensing Act 2003 also makes it a requirement that before determining or revising its Policy for a three year period, a Licensing Authority must consult:-
 - (a) the Chief Officer of Police for the Licensing Authority's area:
 - (b) the Fire Authority for that area;
 - (c) such persons as the Licensing Authority considers to be representative of holders of Premises Licences issued by that Authority;
 - such persons as the Licensing Authority considers to be representative of holders of Club Premises Certificates issued by that Authority;
 - such persons as the Licensing Authority considers to be representative of holders of personal licences issued by that Authority; and
 - (f) such other persons as the Licensing Authority considers to be representative of businesses and residents in its area.
- 3.7 On 25th November 2013 the Licensing Committee considered a draft revised Statement of Licensing Policy and approved it for the purpose of consultation with all relevant parties.
- 3.8 The consultation was commenced on 2nd December 2013 and lasted for a period of twelve weeks. The consultation was carried out via the Council's website and the following were all contacted directly to draw attention to the consultation:

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- The Chief Officer of West Mercia Police
- Hereford and Worcester Fire and Rescue Service
- All other responsible authorities under the Licensing Act 2003
- Various bodies that represent the licensed trade
- Bromsgrove District Councillors
- Parish Councils.
- 3.9 Only one response was received during the consultation period, which was from Hereford and Worcester Fire and Rescue Service. The response received can be seen at Appendix 1.
- 3.10 The Fire and Rescue Service suggested some minor amendments to paragraph 6.2 of the draft revised Statement of Policy, relating to the requirements on plans submitted with applications. These amendments have been incorporated into the finalised Statement of Licensing Policy shown at Appendix 2.

4. RISK MANAGEMENT

4.1 If the Statement of Licensing Policy is not reviewed and updated, the decisions taken by the Council under the Licensing Act 2003 could be subject to legal challenge.
