Dear Licensing Department,

I am writing on behalf of Catshill Baptist Church to express our concern at the proposed licence for the Co-OP (to be built on the site of the IVY COTTAGE public house opposite Catshill Baptist Church in Gibb Lane, Catshill.) to sell Alcohol from 0600 am to 2300 pm.

We feel that this proposal is excessive and should not be allowed bearing in mind the problems that the local community has experienced in the past with other local shops irresponsibly selling alcohol. This has led to countless problems with alcohol related and youth bad behaviour in the area.

We have been helping the Police and local authorities to try to alleviate these problems and now feel that this will adds to the problems.

As a matter of principal, we feel that the selling of Alcohol should be better controlled.

We are concerned about the possibility of damage to the Church and the adverse effects of people using our car park, causing litter, broken glass etc, etc.

We would ask for serious consideration to be given to this proposal and at least cut down the hours which Alcohol can be sold.

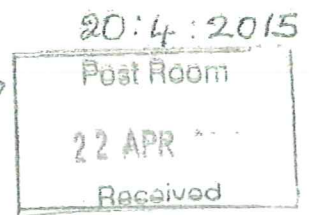
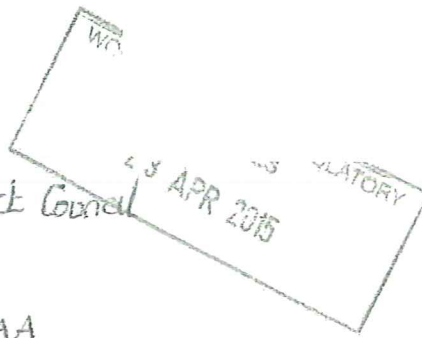

We are writing to object to the application by the Co-operative Retailers, for a license to sell alcohol during the hours 7 am till 11.00 pm at the above site on the corner of Lybb Lane & Borley Mow Lane, Catshill.

Our objections relate to the nuisance factor these lengthy licensing hours will attract because -

- 1) The site is in a residential area in close proximity to many homes & on a busy road junction.
- 2) Opposite the site there is a Church which hosts clubs for children & the elderly amongst others in the community.
- 3) The availability of alcohol till 11pm will encourage teenagers etc to hang around the adjacent Parish Garden, the church car park opposite, as well as on the store car park, till late at night.
