Its success is evident from a busy calendar of usage; however essential/ spending in the current year is particularly challenging. Monies have been earmarked for renovations to the children's play area in the grounds of the village hall but it is urgent improvements to the main building for which NHB support is sought. New housing developments will bring additional visitors to the hall and the project will help ensure the hall will cope with the volume and continue to go from strength to strength as a public building.

The project is intended to commence in the late Autumn to ensure a prompt resumption of the hall's role in the community. This is particularly relevant both post Covid-19, which is likely to see the hall being used more intensively, particularly by the elderly who will be reluctant to travel further afield, and with the provision of major new house building in the area.

 The new housing developments are expected to bring additional visitors to the hall, given that our facilities are open to those both within and outside of the Parish. Our project will help ensure that we are able to cope with additional visitor volume and that the hall continues to go from strength to strength as a public building.
