ST JOHNS EAST (SJC) POLLING STATION REVIEW

1. SUMMARY

1.1 To consider a temporary replacement for the Ryland Centre, New Road, Bromsgrove which is the current polling place for the St Johns East Polling District (SJC) following very recent notification of major renovation work during 2010.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

2.1 That the Committee approve and adopt the United Reform Church Hall, Windsor Street, Bromsgrove as a temporary alternative polling place for the St Johns West Polling District (SJA) whilst renovation at the Ryland Centre, New Road, Bromsgrove is carried out.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 In undertaking the review, the Council must seek to ensure that all electors have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances, and have regard to the needs of electors who are disabled.
- 3.2 Consultation has been sought from local District and County Council Members.

4. FINDINGS

4.1 All polling places and polling stations within the District have been evaluated in terms of suitability and accessibility. The law says that facilities for voting must be reasonable and practicable. What this means in practice is a matter of judgement, but there is certainly no duty on the Council to make an unreasonably high level of provision, or to provide facilities in locations where it is impracticable to do so.

4.2 The United Reformed Church Hall, Windsor Street, Bromsgrove was previously used as a polling place. It has a large main room suitable for use as a polling station and its toilet facilities has recently renovated to DDA standards. There are two small step to the double door entrance to the Hall which will require a temporary ramp to be put into place at an election. The owners of the Hall have indicated that they are seeking finance to provide a permanent ramp to this door. Car parking at the Hall is limited but there is a public car park within 20 metres.

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 There will be a cost for provision of a temporary ramp for access where there is small step at the double door entrance to the United Reformed Church Hall which can be recovered from the General Election accounts claim.

6. <u>LEGAL IMPLICATIONS</u>

6.1. In accordance with the requirements of section 18C of the Representation of the People Act 1983.
