Dear Sir or Madam,

Further to the temporary preservation order you have placed on the oak tree at the corner of our land. After consideration we write to make our objection. Our concern is the location of this tree in relation to our proposed new extension. We have recently received planning application approval. The tree will be only one metre from the property and towers above us at about 70 feet high. Should any of the larger branches fall away they will probably crash through our new roof. We worry that as it grows the tree trunk will push closer to the property. It will be intimidating to be living under the branches of such a large tree. We feel damage to our property in the future is inevitable. In the meantime as the work on the property progresses, we are taking the precautions to protect the tree roots. This was a condition of the planning approval. We understand that even if the tree is cut down the roots will remain and aid ground stability.
